Bicycles – Respecting the Regulating and Licensing of

(Regulations made under the authority of Section 248 of “THE MOTOR VEHICLE ACT”)

Permit Required

1. No resident of the Town of Truro shall on any street of the Town of Truro operate a bicycle in respect of which no permit or number plate has been issued, as provided in these regulations.

How Granted

2. (1) Such permit and number plate shall be issued by the Chief of Police of the Town of Truro, and shall permit the operation of the bicycle specified therein.
(2) No permit shall be issued for any bicycle which, at the time of application therefore, it is not equipped with a bell or horn in good working order.

Contents of Permit

3. The Permit shall contain the name and address of the owner of the bicycle, its serial number, its size and trade name, and the number of the permit, and shall state that the operation of the bicycle described therein is authorized within the Town of Truro.

Number Plates

4. Together with the permit, there shall be issued to the applicant therefore a number plate bearing a number corresponding to that on the permit, and such number plate shall be kept displayed in a conspicuous place on such bicycle.

Fee for Permit

5. The fee for such permit and number plate shall be Two dollars (\$2.00).

Change of Bicycles

6. If a bicycle in respect of which such permit and number plate has been issued is sold or exchanged during the period in which such permit is in effect, a new permit for any bicycle subsequently acquired by the person to whom such permit was originally issued may be obtained without cost, having the same number as that previously issued and the number as that previously issued and the number plate previously issued may be attached to such bicycle subsequently acquired by the owner of the bicycle to which the permit was originally issued.

New Number Plates

7. The Chief of Police shall supply a new number plate to any person to whom a permit and a number plate has been issued and who submits to the Chief of Police evidence to his satisfaction that such number plate has been stolen. The Chief of Police shall make such alterations in the permit as are necessary in order to make the number plate agree and shall keep a record of such alteration. The fee for such new number plate shall be twenty-five cents.

Duplicate Permit and Plates

8. In the event that any number plate or permit issued hereunder is lost, mutilated or has become illegible, the person who is entitled thereto shall make immediate application for and obtain a duplicate or substitute therefore upon furnishing information of such fact satisfactory to the Chief of Police and upon payment of the said fee of Two dollars (\$2.00).

Penalty

9.
 - (1) Every resident of the Town of Truro who operates on any street in the Town a bicycle in respect of which a permit has not been issued or;
 - (2) Operates on any such street any bicycle to which is not attached a number plate issued by the Chief of Police under this Ordinance; shall for every day on which such offence is committed be liable for a penalty not exceeding five dollars, or in default of payment to imprisonment for a period not exceeding one week.
